## BIBLIOGRAPHY

### BIBLIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:

The following is a list of the principal works referred to in the course of writing the text. Shorter notices, discussions following papers, newspaper references and individual letters or interviews have been excluded for reasons of convenience. Full references can be found in the 'Notes'.

Otherwise, the bibliography has been divided into seven relatively manageable sections: unpublished sources; published works by Pitt Rivers; published sources prior to 1900, books and articles listed separately; published sources after 1900, again dividing books and articles; and finally, reference works, published reports and other materials not easily incorporated under the other headings.

Given the nature of the material, the more typical division of the bibliography into 'primary' and 'secondary' sources was not considered the most advantageous; too many primary sources were also secondary ones and vice versa. The arrangement followed, therefore, is meant to convey a sense of the relative distribution of materials as well as emphasizing the cut-off date of 1900, the year of Pitt Rivers' death.
